he Harrison House has had a busy summer season. Mary Hitchcock, Maryanne Hall, Karen Fortunati and Jane Bouley cleaned the objects and furniture in the house followed by a heavy cleaning by Hallys of Branford. The Fortunati family helped trim around the yard. Virginia Page and Jane Bouley have met weekly to inventory, measure, and photograph the contents of the house comparing the results to a previous inventory. The attic storage space has been reorganized and cleaned. The outhouse has been painted and the front of the house touched up.

Nadja Cardona and Jane Bouley have been meeting to freshen and label the exhibits in the Hall Chamber or Exhibit Room. A focus on Branford's maritime, military, industrial, and children's objects continues. The Society still has on display documents and objects from the Civil War and have added are three items from the Revolutionary War.

From the Archives

s part of the exhibit marking the 200th anniversary of the Civil War is a bible found by Rodolphus Bartholomew of Branford on the field after the Battle of Chancellorsville, Virginia on May 3, 1863.

Bartholomew was forty-two years of age when he enlisted in Co. B of the 27th Connecticut Volunteer Infantry in 1862. He was an ambulance driver for the regiment and also saw action at the Battle of Fredericksburg. The 27th was discharged on July 27, 1863.

Bartholomew died in Branford in 1905 at the age of 85 and is buried in Center Cemetery. He lived at 36 Windmill Hill Road later known as the Governor John Brainard house which still stands today. \Psi

In January, Richard Radune, explained how the topography and use of the Sound affected the history of the colony and the new nation. Branford Land Trust cosponsored this program.

Post card aficionados were out in February to hear Jane Bouley give a presentation of Pine Orchard postcards and see hundreds of other cards of historic Branford.

A Genealogy five-session workshop was offered about starting your own genealogy research by Gregory Thompson, noted Connecticut genealogist in March.


Fire vehicles were parked near the Blackstone Library as members of
